## Letter from the Executive Director

---



Dear Family Center Friends and Supporters,

For a lot of us, a 40th birthday is a major milestone. But this year, mine held something extra. As a mom, I planned on this year marking a big change, because my daughter, Kiara, would turn 18 and head off to college. But I didn't anticipate another major change in store.

This year, the Chair of The Family Center's Board of Directors notified me that I had been selected as the new Executive Director. So there I found myself greeting my 40th year, waving goodbye to my 18-year old, and getting used to being "mom" to a 12-year old social service agency. I am honored and excited to be carrying forward the legacy of our founding Executive Director, Barbara Draimin, and I feel deeply grateful to be supported by our Board of Directors and The Family Center's amazingly dedicated staff and volunteers.

Today, twelve years after we started, helping families stay together is still our chief objective. In that time we have served more than 1,400 families, including several thousand children whose parents struggle to maintain their families as they face serious illnesses like HIV/AIDS, cancer, or lupus. Because we know that each family is unique and requires services tailored to its specific needs, we partner with a wide range of public and private supporters to offer more diverse and complete services. Our newest partner is the NYC Administration for Children's Services, who has funded us to work intensively with adolescents at risk for out-of-home placement. This year we also received generous funding from the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation for our work with women battling breast cancer.

At TFC we are proud that we continue to develop our own unique services and strengths. To facilitate our HIV clients' access to the best health care possible, we now have more resources, and additional staff, devoted to helping them get and maintain knowledge of the medications they take, the side effects they may experience, and the clinical trials available to them. With generous support from our friends at The Robin Hood Foundation, we developed and implemented a new agency-wide client database system and strengthened our fiscal management.

We recognize the importance of staying active in our community of service providers. I continue to represent the agency as a member of the NY HIV Health and Human Services Planning Council. As well, because of our expertise, Family Center staff are often called on to share our research findings through scholarly publications and presentations; this year we presented at the NIMH Annual conference on the Role of Families in Preventing and Adapting to HIV/AIDS, the Ryan White All Grantee meeting, and had several scholarly papers published.

So it's been a big year personally, and collectively. With all of these accomplishments behind us, we are optimistic about facing the challenges to come. One of the biggest is that the time has come for us to find a new home. In the year ahead The Family Center will be moving, and we are now starting to look for a new home to replace our office at 66 Reade Street.

But no matter where we are, of course, the real heart and soul of our work never varies. What counts most – what is so important to all of us at The Family Center – is that clients know that they are not alone, and feel that they are members of a community. That is, after all, the true meaning of family – and that's our middle name.

From the very beginning, our founders had a single focus – to provide necessary social and legal services, daily comfort and support, and much love to families facing loss. When a parent faces a life-threatening illness and worries about who will be there to care for their children, the decisions that must be made are painful and complicated. The staff of The Family Center patiently and compassionately work with parents to help them make a plan and ease some of their concerns so that they may worry less about their children’s future and focus more on the joy of being a parent and relishing the time they have to spend with their children now.

We understand the importance of planning, but we also understand the healing value of fun. I have seen the programs at The Family Center bring smiles to the faces of the children we serve and then in turn to the parents and caregivers who love them. Imagine as a parent recounts the delight and wonder of a child who had never been out of her neighborhood, but has now spent a weekend in the country, seen stars on a summer night and held a cricket. Grants made by generous donors enable us to send children to summer sleep away camp.

Thanks to volunteers who give generously of their time and home, The Family Center also is able to

extend opportunities for parents and children to spend time in the country all year long through weekend getaways to “Lakota,” a lodge on the Delaware River. Working together with staff, volunteers, and donors, parents are able to do more than plan for the future, they are able to help their children explore and grow, beyond the boundaries set by their circumstances.

After serving on the Board of The Family Center for the last six years I accepted the role of Board Chair this past January. We are at a critical juncture in our growth and development. We value all the ways you support us as we continue to explore each day new and better ways to accomplish our mission, look for new streams of funding, research new interventions, and build new partnerships. We remain as focused as our founders were on the day they began The Family Center - on the families we are here to serve so they always know they are not alone.

From all of us and the families we serve each day, thank you.

The Family Center works to create a more secure present and future for children whose parents have a life-threatening illness by providing comprehensive legal and social services, education and research. Our work is fueled by the belief that every child deserves an answer to the question: *Who Will Take Care of Me?*

### Who do we serve:

For our first workshop, the focus was peanuts. In fact, roasted peanuts contain as many antioxidants as strawberries and blueberries. # New and Renewed Programming in Brooklyn...

### **YouthNet: Caring for Families - Preventing Adolescent Foster Care**

The Family Center helps families maintain stability in the midst of many different types of challenges. Through a new partnership with the New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS), The Family Center's *YouthNet* program provides intensive preventive services to reduce the risk of adolescent placement in foster care. *YouthNet* also provides

aftercare services, such as permanency planning for adolescents coming out of foster care, to reduce the chance of replacement. *YouthNet* will provide services to 75 teens and their families in Brooklyn annually. We are looking forward to joining forces with ACS to ensure that children and their families remain together.

### **Project Talk: Serving Minority Women in Brooklyn with Breast Cancer**



The Family Center began its relationship with the Susan G. Komen Foundation in 2002. At that time their support allowed us to demonstrate the responsiveness of our service model to the needs of women with breast cancer and their families. Now with a renewed relationship with Komen Greater NYC and a generous grant of \$75,000, we are expanding the number of minority women with breast cancer served in some of the most economically challenged neighborhoods of Brooklyn. Through *Project Talk*, Family Center staff provides integrated legal and social services to mothers living with cancer and their families. We also continue the important work of raising awareness among cancer providers about the need for these services and their availability through The Family Center.

On Sunday, September 10th, TFC staff, clients, volunteers, family and friends participated in the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure. The TFC Team raised over \$1,100.
