The New York State Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)

- 1. What is ERAP? ERAP is a new, time-limited government program that will provide money for rent arrears, utility arrears, and temporary rental assistance payments for some New Yorkers who have experienced financial hardship because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. Who is eligible? To be eligible, you must:
 - Live in an eligible county within NY State (residents of all 5 NYC boroughs are eligible):
 - Have a household income below 80% AMI (area median income) for your county (see below). You can use either your 2020 or your 2021 household income to qualify:
 - Have received unemployment benefits or otherwise experienced financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; and
 - Owe your current landlord rent that was due on or after March 13, 2020.

The ERAP program is open to people with ANY immigration status. including undocumented immigrants.

- 3. How do I know if my income is under 80% AMI? NYC households qualify if their gross income is under: \$66,850 for a household of 1; \$76,400 for a household of 2; \$85,950 for a household of 3; and \$95,450 for a household of 4. - 4. What kind of assistance can I get? The program may pay up to 12 months of rent or utility arrears. Some households that have a high rent burden (rent is over 30% of their income) may be eligible for up to three months of additional rental assistance. Payments will be made directly to landlords and utility companies.
- 5. How do I apply? Beginning June 1, 2021, you can apply online at https:// otda.ny.gov/programs/Emergency-Rental-Assistance/. We do not yet know how long funds will remain available.
